Yard Smart Program



Yard Smart is part of the Ecology Action Center's Clean Water Program. It's a voluntary effort to encourage residents to reduce synthetic pesticide use, conserve natural resources and make room for wildlife. Yard Smart promotes yard care practices that are safe for children, pets and the environment. The program aims to recognize local homeowners who use ecologically-sustainable practices in their yard to the benefit of the whole community.

Why Be Yard Smart?

We want a lot from our yards; we want them to bring beauty to our home and neighborhood, be an inviting space for play, laughter, and gatherings, and to provide sanctuary from hectic daily life.

Sometime our attempts to beautify our yards can cause unintended harm, especially when we use synthetic pesticides (like weed killers and insecticides). The simple choices we make for yard care can have a big impact on the health of the whole community, from the water we drink, to the air we breathe.

“Unintended” Human Health Concerns

- Weed killers (i.e. 2,4-D) are linked to rising rates of lymphoma in 75 of 99 human studies according to the National Lymphoma Society.
- Women who used lawn services had higher rates of breast cancer, according to a Massachusetts study.
- Children are 6 times more likely to have leukemia if their parents used garden pesticides and herbicides once a month or more, according to a Los Angeles study.
- Over the long term, several types of cancer, damage to nervous systems, birth defects, and infertility have been associated with exposure to common lawn care products.

Environmental Concerns

- A study of air pollution in California found that mower emissions per year equaled that produced by 3,500,000 automobiles driven 16,000 miles each.
- Habitat loss is the number one threat to wildlife today. You can help restore the balance by creating a place for wildlife in your yard.

Three Categories of Certification

The Chemical-Free Yard

Avoids using synthetic pesticides, which can harm humans, wildlife and the environment. Avoids the use of synthetic ammonia fertilizers which can contaminate groundwater and kill beneficial soil microorganisms.

The Easy on the Earth Yard

Reduces waste and conserves natural resources like water and fossil fuels. Minimizes recourse-intensive turf grass, and promotes a healthy, diverse ecosystem. If synthetic pesticides are needed, homeowners practice Integrated Pest Management with use of the least toxic pesticides.

The Wildlife Habitat Yard

Provides the basic requirements for wildlife to survive and flourish. Encourages a diverse wildlife population by landscaping with native plants, supplying adequate food and water, and providing a variety of shelter areas.

How Do I Apply for Certification?

To apply for Yard Smart certification, stop by the **Ecology Action Center** or visit yardsmart.org.

Take the Yard Smart Pledge, complete the form and send it with a \$15 donation to the EAC to receive a yard smart sign. You can request certification guidelines and application forms with this order, or download forms from the above websites.

Complete the application for certification of choice and mail them in for review. For each qualified certification level, you will receive a sticker to affix to the back of your Yard Smart sign. You can apply for additional certification levels at any time.

When you join the Yard Smart program and display the Yard Smart Award in your yard, you are indicating that you've taken the pledge toward supporting ecologically sustainable practices in our community.
