One-stop-drive-through-recycling is available at the expo again this year, from 9am-12 in the north parking lot at the IWU Shirk Center. The following items will be accepted:

- Electronics (no tube style TVs or monitors)
- Textiles wearable or not
- Eyeglasses
- Hearing Aids
- Keys
- Christmas lights
- Corrugated plastic yard signs (such as campaign signs)
- TerraCycle Refer to side margins
- Markers
- Corks
- Thermostats
- Documents for shredding
- Mattresses
- Books in good condition

NOTE: Paints, chemicals, cleaners, batteries, CFLs, tube fluorescent bulbs, and other Household Hazardous Waste items will NOT be accepted at this recycling event. Please stay tuned for updates on a fall 2017 HHW collection.

Rain Barrel Season Approaches: Are You Ready?

According to the Illinois State Climatologist, both February and January 2017 broke heat records in Illinois. One immediate ramification of our warming climate is the early arrival of pest species like mosquitos, which are already out and about. To avoid exacerbating the problem, it is important that we all properly maintain our rain barrels to avoid creating additional mosquito habitat and contributing to the spread of West Nile Virus or other mosquito-borne illnesses.

First, clean out your rain barrel and remove any debris left over from the winter. Next

make sure that your rain barrel has a fine mesh screen on the inlet and the lid securely fits. If you have a 2011 or older rain barrel purchased through EAC, please check to see if the lid of your barrel fits properly and there are no holes or gaps that would allow any mosquitos inside the barrel. Given the very small size of mosquitos, even the smallest gap or crack can allow entry by female mosquitos looking for a place to lay eggs in still water.

If you built or bought an EAC rain barrel after 2011, there should not be any issues with gaps around the lid because we switched to a different rain barrel design. However, you still need to examine your barrel for any damage that might allow mosquito entry. If you need any supplies, like a replacement rain barrel screen or diverter, the EAC has these in stock at reasonable prices.

If you have an old (pre-2011) EAC rain barrel (where the lids were cut off and reattached) you should replace it. In fact, if you remove your old model rain barrel from use, we will give you a \$5 discount off a rain barrel workshop or \$5 off a new ready-to-use rain barrel.

After cleaning things up and making sure there are no holes or gaps in your barrel, it is ready for this upcoming season.

Accepts **foil-lined** energy , granola, meal replacement, and protein bar wrappers and foil lined powdered drink tubes.


