2017 Yard Smart Garden Walk

Join us for our 15th annual Yard Smart Garden Walk on Saturday, June 24, 2017. The event is free and highlights beautiful and functional yards in our community that use sustainable lawn and garden care practices, helping to protect water and provide safe spaces for people, pets and wildlife.

This year's walk focuses on smaller urban gardens maximizing their space, and features several homes with gardens in the front yard. Come see insect homes, 275gallon rain harvesters, and urban agriculture.



We will revisit EAC member Lenore Clark's garden that was on the walk a few years ago. Lenore has a wide variety of plants in her cottage garden and utilizes the entire yard to create cozy spaces for people, plants and animals to enjoy.

Participants will see different kinds of urban agriculture at work at the Second Presbyterian Church's herb and vegetable garden plot, and at the Rogue Carrots urban farm. You might have met the Baez family from Rogue Carrots and toured their bus at the Illinois Sustainable Living and Wellness Expo. They are farming as much of their home's property as possible, and selling their produce at stores like Common Ground.

After the walk, we will reconvene for lunch and hear a presentation by Krista Kirkham from the Nature Conservancy.

Summer Energy Saving Tips

- Make sure your registers are not blocked by any furniture or other objects and vacuum out your registers to remove any dust build-up.
- Keep curtains and blinds closed during the day to reduce heat gain through your windows.
- Line drying clothing is a great way to save energy and freshen up your clothes!
- Install energy efficient lighting to reduce heat in your home.
 Incandescent light bulbs generate a lot of heat, and consume around 75% more energy than LED lamps.

Krista is an aquatic ecologist for the Illinois' Nature Conservancy's

Mackinaw River program. She will talk about McLean County water quantity and quality issues and methods for water and watershed conservation.

As in the past, this event includes a McLean County Freecycle plant and garden tool exchange. We encourage participants to donate and take away



garden tools and/or labelled, potted plants at the free exchange.

The Yard Smart Garden Walk is free and open to the public; however, a \$5 donation to offset the cost of lunch is appreciated. Water will be provided, and participants should bring their own reusable water bottles. The lunch is a zero waste event. EAC Leads Local Climate Efforts

Last week President Trump withdrew from the Paris Climate Accords, the voluntary international agreement that directs each country to set targets for reduction of climate-changing greenhouse gas emissions. This action demonstrates a significant change in direction for the world and our nation; all progress toward addressing climate change in the United States will need to come from the local or state level for the foreseeable future.

Without a doubt, climate change is real and we are already starting to see the impacts. But it's not too late to make a difference–and the biggest potential for progress is at the local level.

The Ecology Action Center, as the environmental agency for Bloomington-Normal and McLean County, is currently conducting its second greenhouse gas emissions inventory for our community. The first GHG inventory was conducted in 2014 using 2008 energy use data to create an emissions baseline. This year's inventory is broader in scope, including other air quality emissions such as ozone, which are regulated under the National Ambient Air Quality Standards, and can be dangerous to public health. Following the quantification of current emissions levels, the EAC will launch a collaborative strategic planning process to establish goals for emissions reductions and develop strategies to meet those goals.

This project has limited support from the City of Bloomington and Town of Normal; the Ecology Action Center needs your help to make it successful. Accordingly, the EAC is launching a new public-private partnership; donations to the new **BN Clean Air Fund** will support our efforts to improve and maintain air quality in Bloomington-Normal. As a 501 (c) (3) nonprofit organization, contributions to the EAC are deductible to the extent allowable by law. Mclean County HHW Donations

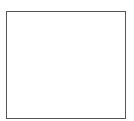
