New! Sugar Creek Stewards Program

Come join us for our third workday of the year on Saturday, July 16! We had great groups come out in May and June to work on Sugar Creek along Constitution Trail in the City of Bloomington and near Anderson Park in the Town of Normal, and removed <u>loads</u> of hemlock, garlic mustard, honeysuckle and other invasive plants, making room for the milkweed, native grasses, and damselflies and butterflies that we saw. In July, we'll be working along Sugar Creek at another cool site in the City of Bloomington!

Learn about rivers and floodplains, the importance of native grasses and flowers to wildlife and humans, and the differences between native, non-native and naturalized plants, as well as invasive and aggressive plants. We will teach you what "the good, the bad, and the ugly" plants look like, and the best ways to remove them, and you can help us take out the bad to make room for the good.



We will work from 9 am to 12 pm on the 3rd Saturday of the month throughout the year – invasives never sleep, so neither can we!

Volunteers must be 18 years old or older (or 14 and accompanied by a parent or guardian) and be able to hike along uneven terrain and safely use basic hand tools such as loppers and bow saws. Please wear long pants, closed toe shoes, and bring your own work gloves and bottle of water (reusable bottle, of course).

The Green Top Grocery co-op is inviting Ecology Action Center members and everyone in the community to its groundbreaking party on Tuesday, June 28, at 4:30 p.m. at 921 East Washington in Bloomington (the empty lot next to the Beer Nuts factory). Bring your own shovel!

Ecologically friendly food growth and community ownership are what will make Green Top different from traditional grocery stores. The store, which will open for business in mid-2017, will be "built" on the following guiding principles:

- Many of the products and services will be similar to what is found in other stores, but the number-one priority will be providing healthy foods while promoting a healthy environment.
- Many of the foods featured will come from local, independent farmers and producers.
- Clear labeling, reliable product information and educating the community about healthy eating will be emphasized.

Being a co-op means Green Top Grocery is owned by members of the community, but everyone will be welcome to shop there regardless of whether they are a member. Ways you can be involved will be by shopping there, volunteering for educational events, making tax-deductible contributions through the Illinois Prairie Community Foundation or becoming a co-op owner.

Each year, the EAC presents two awards to exceptional environmental stewards. This year's awards were presented at our newest fundraiser, Zymurgy, on June 2.



The McLean County Recycling Award was presented to the Bloomington- Normal Marriott. This Four-Diamond hotel offers single stream recycling throughout the facility, both to customers in every guest room and conference room, but also in offices and kitchens. They are an active participant in local food composting efforts, work closely with local nonprofits to donate furniture, carpeting, and more for reuse, find new homes for other unneeded materials through active use of McLean County Freecycle, and encourage positive behaviors by the full staff by organizing annual trail clean up activities.

The Anne McGowan Making a World of Difference Award was presented to Jeff Pritts, General Manager of the Bloomington Normal Marriott.


Jeff is a local role model in implementing
