Yard Smart Garden Walk June 29, 2019 9:00 am -12:30 pm

The 17th annual Yard Smart Garden walk is on Saturday, June 29, 2019. Please join us on this **FREE** tour that highlights beautiful and functional yards in our community that use

environmentally friendly practices to protect our water and provide a safe place for people, pets, and wildlife. This year's walk features a family garden that is repopulating a wooded space with native plants, a beehive, a fully landscaped front



yard, and more! You will see a diversity of styles, plants, and yard smart methods. After the garden walk, we reconvene for lunch from Green Top Grocery, a Freecycle exchange of plants and garden tools, and a presentation by Bill Inks from AB Hatchery about the benefits of and how to use organic garden products. Yard Smart promotes a healthier more sustainable approach to lawn and garden maintenance. Working with nature to build a balanced ecosystem in both the soil below ground and the yard above ground reduces pollutants that runoff into our local water supply, and produces a more beautiful, sustainable and safer environment for everyone. The program encourages local homeowners to reduce the use of synthetic fertilizers and pesticides, conserve natural resources such as water and fossil fuels, and make room for wildlife in their yards. Yard Smart Certification recognizes local homeowners who use ecologically sustainable practices in maintaining their yards and who realize that their lawn, garden and landscaping decisions affect the health of the whole community.

Build-Your-Own Composter Workshops Are Back!

The Ecology Action Center is excited to once again offer our build-your-own compost bin workshop. After an extended hiatus due to a significant loss of supplies and workshop space from a fire in later 2017, we will be hosting our first compost workshop of 2019 on Wednesday, June 26 at 6:00 pm. Workshop fees are \$60 (\$50 for EAC members) and include everything needed to successfully begin home composting. Various types of compost systems and techniques will be discussed in addition to troubleshooting tips to avoid potential problems. Backyard composting is the easiest way to reduce garbage from home and create rich soil nutrients to feed the garden at the same time. By taking advantage of natural processes, the amount of residential waste being landfilled can be reduced while also producing a valuable organic fertilizer. Participants will make and take home a composter ready for use with instruction on setup and maintenance. This workshop will also mark the debut of our new compost bin model. These new bins are constructed with two pieces that can detach for easy transportation and relocation.

Clean Water and Stormwater Drain Stenciling

Heavy and extended rainfall can often result in more pollution being discharged into our local waterways, as stormwater spends washes across impermeable surfaces like roadways, parking lots and sidewalks, picking up various pollutants along the way. It is critical that we keep our local water resources clean enough for consumption by doing our part to protect both the quantity and quality of our water resources, which serve as our sources of drinking water. The EAC is here to assist residents with making environmentally-conscious decisions when it comes to how we use and interact with water in our community.

Harvesting rainwater runoff is a low energy, high impact option that helps reduce stormwater pollution by lessening the amount of rainwater traveling across the landscape. Residents are encouraged to take advantage of the EAC's next rain barrel workshop on **June 27 at 6:00 pm**. This convenient, at-home water harvesting system helps protect the quality of our local waterways in addition to helping residents save money on their water bills. Why Should YOU Recycle?

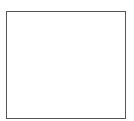
