Ecology Action Center Recycling Education for McLean County

2011 Annual Report

January 1, 2011 – December, 2011

The Ecology Action Center has completed the following items in fulfillment of the Solid Waste and Waste Reduction Education Program agreement of January 1, 2011.

Solid Waste Coordinator Activities

- Surveyed area waste haulers, recyclers, municipalities, and large organizations to gather data for annual calculation of county-wide municipal solid waste generation rate and recycling rate. Official rates were reported to the Illinois EPA as well as announced publicly; local radio stations and newspapers reported the improving rates as a story.
- Facilitated Solid Waste Technical Committee meeting and subsequent actions, including coordination of recycling grants program for McLean County Schools.
- Participated in permitting process of B & B Bedding Pollution Control Facility.
- Coordinated McLean County small municipality recycling grants program, resulting in \$2,500 in support for recycling programs awarded to the communities of Arrowsmith, Downs, Carlock, Heyworth, and Lexington.
- Coordinated McLean County schools recycling program, resulting in \$2,880 in support for recycling programs awarded to Colene Hoose School, Lexington Elementary School, and Sheridan School.
- Facilitated quarterly McLean County Solid Waste Technical Committee meetings and follow-up reporting to the McLean County Land Use Committee.
- Household Hazardous Waste update sent to 813 email addresses and 581 Facebook followers.
- Household Hazardous Waste interviews on WJBC and in Pantagraph as a result of press releases issued by the EAC.
- Researched costs and logistics of holding a locally funded Household Hazardous Waste collection event given the ongoing absence of state funding for the foreseeable future.
- Ongoing EAC Executive Director participation in the statewide Illinois Recycling Association Board of Directors, including
 participation in the annual statewide recycling conference.
- Ongoing administration and promotion of Compact Fluorescent Lamp (CFL) recycling program with 3 drop-off points in Bloomington and Normal.
- Ongoing administration and promotion of Household Battery recycling program in conjunction with Interstate Batteries, Batteries Plus, and Springfield Electric (21,961 total pounds recycled in this calendar year).
- Ongoing administration of Illinois Plastic Pot Recycling Program in cooperation with the McLean County Master Gardeners.
- Performed annual residential waste audit to determine trends in waste generation and usage of local recycling programs.
- Enlisted ISU Stevenson Center graduate class to perform community-wide recycling assessment. The resulting 85-page report from their scientifically conducted survey will be utilized in the 5-year update to the McLean County Solid Waste Management Plan to be conducted in 2012.
- Launched fundraising campaign to raise \$125,000 to hold the first Household Hazardous Waste Collection Event in McLean County in over 4 years. Event is planned for September 2012.
- Notified 50 local electronics retailers of their obligation under the state electronics recycling law to provide consumers with
 information on electronics recycling at the time of purchase. Provided each retailer with two copies of a color flier to help
 themcomply with this regulation.

- Produced four quarterly issues of EAC paper newsletter featuring solid waste issues among other topics. Mailed to approximately 250 households each issue and made available as free download on EAC website.
- Administration and promotion of McFreecycle, a free listserv on the internet for the free exchange of materials in McLean County to avoid disposal of useable items. EAC staff facilitated migration of entire McFreecycle listserv from Yahoo Groups to the more functional custom built Freecycle.org site (1273 current members with an average of 837 messages exchanged monthly).
- Updated county-wide recycling information at www.ecologyactioncenter.org and www.Earth911.com as well as submission of local recycling data to the new statewide EcoPoint website hosted by the Illinois Recycling Association.
- Answered phone calls and other inquires about the disposal of household hazardous waste and recycling (200 inquiries about recycling/waste disposal, 244 inquiries about household hazardous waste, and 178 inquiries about electronics recycling).
- Awarded the annual McLean County Green Awards at the April Illinois Sustainable Living and Wellness Expo. The McLean
 County Waste Reduction and Recycling Award recognized ISU's innovative food scrap composting project which allows local
 businesses to reduce their waste landfilled by composting food waste instead. The McLean County World of Difference

Award was presented to multiple recipients, all previous leaders of Operation Recycle and Ecology Action Center, for their efforts to build the small organization into the respected community agency it is today.

- Talking Trash teacher newsletter sent out electronically twice yearly as a resource for educators on solid waste issues.
- Promotion of EAC's 40th Anniversary utilizing "40 Green Ideas" campaign including strong focus on solid waste issues
 received extensive media coverage including stories in The Bloomington Pantagraph, WMBD TV 31, WGLT, and the ISU
 Vidette.
- Hosted group of Sustainability professionals on tour from Peoria with information about EAC's efforts in regards to Solid Waste Reduction and clean water protect education and outreach (30 participants).
- Provided content for WGLT's Uncommon Knowledge science program on the problems of compostable plastics reaching thousands of area listeners.
- EAC staff attended Zero Waste for Businesses and Communities Training Workshop at the national Resource Recycling Conference.
- Panel Discussion on Sustainable Solutions for Small Businesses (25 attendees).
- Co-coordinated America Recycles Day Mega Recycling Event at Illinois Wesleyan University. Over 350 households recycled
 thousands of pounds of electronics, textiles, light bulbs, batteries and garden pots. Each participant was given information
 about recycling these items year anytime and also updates about the Household Hazardous Waste collection.
- EAC press releases resulted in Bloomington Pantagraph stories on Household Hazardous Waste and Electronics Recycling as well as interviews on WGLT and two on WJBC about America Recycles Day and Household Hazardous Waste.
- Coordinated efforts of a work group from the Multicultural Leadership Program working to increase recycling behavior in underserved populations.
- Sent EAC Action News email newsletter to over 700 email addresses to promote recycling and waste reduction.
